

Information for Donors About Bequests

There are several ways you can name The Outdoor Circle as a beneficiary in your Will or trust. You may choose to give a dollar amount, specific assets, a percentage of your estate, or some or all of your remaining estate after payment of other bequests.

Sample Bequest Language for Wills and Trusts

You can simply leave a gift outright to The Outdoor Circle or you may state how you would like your gift to be used. For example, you may

- Designate “wherever the need is greatest” so that The Outdoor Circle can choose to how to best use your gift to fulfill our mission.
- Direct your gift to one of our programs such as “Education” or “Trees”.
- Direct your gift to our Annual Fund or our Endowment Fund.

Specific amount:

I give to The Outdoor Circle, located in Honolulu, Hawaii, the sum of \$_____ to be used wherever the need is greatest.

Specific asset:

I give to The Outdoor Circle, located in Honolulu, Hawaii the following described property [insert description of asset] to be used wherever the need is greatest.

Real Property:

I give to The Outdoor Circle, located in Honolulu, Hawaii, all of my right, title, and interest in the following described real property [insert legal description of property] to be used wherever the need is greatest.

Portion of the estate:

I give to The Outdoor Circle, located in Honolulu, Hawaii, _____% of my estate to be used wherever the need is greatest.

Residual estate (after other bequests or designations are named):

I give to The Outdoor Circle, located in Honolulu, Hawaii, the rest and residue of my estate to be used wherever the need is greatest.

Portion of Residual estate (after other bequests or designations are named):

I give to The Outdoor Circle, located in Honolulu, Hawaii, _____% of the rest and residue of my estate to be used wherever the need is greatest.
